Auditing Services

Whitetail's experts are Exemplar Global (previously RABQSA) certified lead auditors in ISO 14001 (Environmental Management Systems) and OHSAS 18001 (Occupational Health and Safety Management Systems). We conduct audits for both public and private organizations that adhere to the guiding principles of ISO 19011 (Guidelines for Quality and/or Environmental Management Systems Auditing).

Environmental health and safety (EHS) audits are critical management tools for monitoring and verifying the effective implementation of an organization's EHS policy, procedures, legal and other requirements. Whether they are management system (MS) or compliance audits, they provide organizations the ability to identify risks, resource requirements, and opportunities to help them make informed, mission-focused decisions.

Our EHS Auditing Approach (as outlined by ISO 19011)

- Initiate the audit - defining audit objectives, scope, and criteria.
- Review relevant documents and records prior to onsite audit.
- Prepare audit plan and supporting audit documents.
- Conduct the audit – collect and verify information, generate findings, prepare audit conclusions.
- Preparing, approving, and distributing the audit report.
- Completing the audit.
- Conducting audit follow-up.

Project Examples

- For the US Army Reserve 99th Regional Support Command (RSC), Whitetail Regional Environmental Protection Specialists, located within a 13-state area ranging from Virginia to Maine, ensure the RSC's facilities are operated and maintained in accordance with all environmental regulations.
